

Distance and Elevation: 13.6 miles and 1700 feet of climbing

Trailhead Location: Trinity County Brewing Company - Main Street - Weaverville, CA

Route Directions:

- 1. 299 to Weaver Bally Road turn right at the Weaver Bally Trailhead (upper lot) and stay left next few intersections.
- 2. West Garden Gulch Spur to East Garden Gulch up the west side, cross the creek, down the east side.
- 3. Howe Ditch on to Howe Ditch, stay on this until the hard left connector up to East Weaver Creek Trail.
- 4. East Weaver Creek Trail to Day Ranch (Ewok) left up the hill on Day Ranch and onward to the Jack Ass Ridge Trail
- 5. Jack Ass Ridge uphill on this trail. After a fun climb and descent, look for the Blue Lead Trail
- 6. Blue Lead Trail head downhill, stay left on the intermediate trail until it intersects with Garden Gulch, take a left
- 7. Ten Cent Gulch to Garden Gulch to Weaver Bally right at Ten Cent Gulch (look for the shovel), stay straight at the bottom and finish onto Taylor Street
- 8. Taylor Street to Court Street to 299 right onto all these roads, finish at the Brewery where you started

Summary: This Bigfoot Adventure Challenge route is an intermediate level challenge on the amazing Weaverville Basin Trail network. The rider can expect green and blue level old school and relatively new trails in sometimes oak woodland and other times conifer dominated forests with challenging climbing to an extended and varied descent and downtown Weaverville finish.
